CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

FAR 52.212-4 - CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS—COMMERCIAL PRODUCTS AND COMMERCIAL SERVICES (NOV 2021)

(a) *Inspection/Acceptance.* The Contractor shall only tender for acceptance those items that conform to the requirements of this contract. The Government reserves the right to inspect or test any supplies or services that have been tendered for acceptance. The Government may require repair or replacement of nonconforming supplies or reperformance of nonconforming services at no increase in contract price. If repair/replacement or reperformance will not correct the defects or is not possible, the Government may seek an equitable price reduction or adequate consideration for acceptance of nonconforming supplies or services. The Government must exercise its post-acceptance rights-

(1) Within a reasonable time after the defect was discovered or should have been discovered; and

(2) Before any substantial change occurs in the condition of the item, unless the change is due to the defect in the item.

(b) *Assignment.* The Contractor or its assignee may assign its rights to receive payment due as a result of performance of this contract to a bank, trust company, or other financing institution, including any Federal lending agency in accordance with the Assignment of Claims Act ([31 U.S.C. 3727](#)). However, when a third party makes payment (e.g., use of the Governmentwide commercial purchase card), the Contractor may not assign its rights to receive payment under this contract.

(c) *Changes.* Changes in the terms and conditions of this contract may be made only by written agreement of the parties.

(d) *Disputes.* This contract is subject to [41 U.S.C. chapter 71](#), Contract Disputes. Failure of the parties to this contract to reach agreement on any request for equitable adjustment, claim, appeal or action arising under or relating to this contract shall be a dispute to be resolved in accordance with the clause at Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) [52.233-1](#), Disputes, which is incorporated herein by reference. The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any dispute arising under the contract.

(e) *Definitions.* The clause at FAR [52.202-1](#), Definitions, is incorporated herein by reference.

(f) *Excusable delays.* The Contractor shall be liable for default unless nonperformance is caused by an occurrence beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor and without its fault or negligence such as, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, unusually severe weather, and delays of common carriers. The Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing as soon as it is reasonably possible after the commencement of any excusable delay, setting forth the full particulars in connection therewith, shall remedy such occurrence with all reasonable dispatch, and shall promptly give written notice to the Contracting Officer of the cessation of such occurrence.

(g) *Invoice.*

(1) The Contractor shall submit an original invoice and three copies (or electronic invoice, if authorized) to the address designated in the contract to receive invoices. An invoice must include-

- (i) Name and address of the Contractor;
- (ii) Invoice date and number;
- (iii) Contract number, line item number and, if applicable, the order number;
- (iv) Description, quantity, unit of measure, unit price and extended price of the items

delivered;

(v) Shipping number and date of shipment, including the bill of lading number and weight of shipment if shipped on Government bill of lading;

(vi) Terms of any discount for prompt payment offered;

(vii) Name and address of official to whom payment is to be sent;

(viii) Name, title, and phone number of person to notify in event of defective invoice; and
 (ix) Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN). The Contractor shall include its TIN on the invoice only if required elsewhere in this contract.

(x) Electronic funds transfer (EFT) banking information.

(A) The Contractor shall include EFT banking information on the invoice only if required elsewhere in this contract.

(B) If EFT banking information is not required to be on the invoice, in order for the invoice to be a proper invoice, the Contractor shall have submitted correct EFT banking information in accordance with the applicable solicitation provision, contract clause (e.g., [52.232-33](#), Payment by Electronic Funds Transfer-System for Award Management, or [52.232-34](#), Payment by Electronic Funds Transfer-Other Than System for Award Management), or applicable agency procedures.

(C) EFT banking information is not required if the Government waived the requirement to pay by EFT.

(2) Invoices will be handled in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act ([31 U.S.C.3903](#)) and Office of Management and Budget (OMB) prompt payment regulations at 5 CFR Part 1315.

(h) *Patent indemnity*. The Contractor shall indemnify the Government and its officers, employees and agents against liability, including costs, for actual or alleged direct or contributory infringement of, or inducement to infringe, any United States or foreign patent, trademark or copyright, arising out of the performance of this contract, provided the Contractor is reasonably notified of such claims and proceedings.

(i) *Payment.-*

(1) *Items accepted*. Payment shall be made for items accepted by the Government that have been delivered to the delivery destinations set forth in this contract.

(2) *Prompt payment*. The Government will make payment in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act ([31 U.S.C.3903](#)) and prompt payment regulations at 5 CFR Part 1315.

(3) *Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)*. If the Government makes payment by EFT, see [52.212-5\(b\)](#) for the appropriate EFT clause.

(4) *Discount*. In connection with any discount offered for early payment, time shall be computed from the date of the invoice. For the purpose of computing the discount earned, payment shall be considered to have been made on the date which appears on the payment check or the specified payment date if an electronic funds transfer payment is made.

(5) *Overpayments*. If the Contractor becomes aware of a duplicate contract financing or invoice payment or that the Government has otherwise overpaid on a contract financing or invoice payment, the Contractor shall-

(i) Remit the overpayment amount to the payment office cited in the contract along with a description of the overpayment including the-

(A) Circumstances of the overpayment (e.g., duplicate payment, erroneous payment, liquidation errors, date(s) of overpayment);

(B) Affected contract number and delivery order number, if applicable;

(C) Affected line item or subline item, if applicable; and

(D) Contractor point of contact.

(ii) Provide a copy of the remittance and supporting documentation to the Contracting Officer.

(6) *Interest*.

(i) All amounts that become payable by the Contractor to the Government under this contract shall bear simple interest from the date due until paid unless paid within 30 days of becoming due. The interest rate shall be the interest rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury as provided in [41 U.S.C. 7109](#), which is applicable to the period in which the amount becomes due, as provided in (i)(6)(v) of this clause, and then at the rate applicable for each six-month period as fixed by the Secretary until the amount is paid.

(ii) The Government may issue a demand for payment to the Contractor upon finding a debt is due under the contract.

(iii) *Final decisions.* The Contracting Officer will issue a final decision as required by [33.211](#) if—

(A) The Contracting Officer and the Contractor are unable to reach agreement on the existence or amount of a debt within 30 days;

(B) The Contractor fails to liquidate a debt previously demanded by the Contracting Officer within the timeline specified in the demand for payment unless the amounts were not repaid because the Contractor has requested an installment payment agreement; or

(C) The Contractor requests a deferment of collection on a debt previously demanded by the Contracting Officer (see [32.607-2](#)).

(iv) If a demand for payment was previously issued for the debt, the demand for payment included in the final decision shall identify the same due date as the original demand for payment.

(v) Amounts shall be due at the earliest of the following dates:

(A) The date fixed under this contract.

(B) The date of the first written demand for payment, including any demand for payment resulting from a default termination.

(vi) The interest charge shall be computed for the actual number of calendar days involved beginning on the due date and ending on—

(A) The date on which the designated office receives payment from the Contractor;

(B) The date of issuance of a Government check to the Contractor from which an amount otherwise payable has been withheld as a credit against the contract debt; or

(C) The date on which an amount withheld and applied to the contract debt would otherwise have become payable to the Contractor.

(vii) The interest charge made under this clause may be reduced under the procedures prescribed in FAR [32.608-2](#) in effect on the date of this contract.

(j) *Risk of loss.* Unless the contract specifically provides otherwise, risk of loss or damage to the supplies provided under this contract shall remain with the Contractor until, and shall pass to the Government upon:

(1) Delivery of the supplies to a carrier, if transportation is f.o.b. origin; or

(2) Delivery of the supplies to the Government at the destination specified in the contract, if transportation is f.o.b. destination.

(k) *Taxes.* The contract price includes all applicable Federal, State, and local taxes and duties.

(l) *Termination for the Government's convenience.* The Government reserves the right to terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for its sole convenience. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred which reasonably could have been avoided.

(m) *Termination for cause.* The Government may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the Contractor, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the Government, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the Government shall not be liable to the Contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Government for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the Government

improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.

(n) *Title*. Unless specified elsewhere in this contract, title to items furnished under this contract shall pass to the Government upon acceptance, regardless of when or where the Government takes physical possession.

(o) *Warranty*. The Contractor warrants and implies that the items delivered hereunder are merchantable and fit for use for the particular purpose described in this contract.

(p) *Limitation of liability*. Except as otherwise provided by an express warranty, the Contractor will not be liable to the Government for consequential damages resulting from any defect or deficiencies in accepted items.

(q) *Other compliances*. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, executive orders, rules and regulations applicable to its performance under this contract.

(r) *Compliance with laws unique to Government contracts*. The Contractor agrees to comply with [31 U.S.C. 1352](#) relating to limitations on the use of appropriated funds to influence certain Federal contracts; [18 U.S.C. 431](#) relating to officials not to benefit; [40 U.S.C. chapter 37](#), Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards; [41 U.S.C. chapter 87](#), Kickbacks; [41 U.S.C. 4712](#) and [10 U.S.C. 2409](#) relating to whistleblower protections; [49 U.S.C. 40118](#), Fly American; and [41 U.S.C. chapter 21](#) relating to procurement integrity.

(s) *Order of precedence*. Any inconsistencies in this solicitation or contract shall be resolved by giving precedence in the following order:

- (1) The schedule of supplies/services.
- (2) The Assignments, Disputes, Payments, Invoice, Other Compliances, Compliance with Laws Unique to Government Contracts, and Unauthorized Obligations paragraphs of this clause;
- (3) The clause at [52.212-5](#).
- (4) Addenda to this solicitation or contract, including any license agreements for computer software.
- (5) Solicitation provisions if this is a solicitation.
- (6) Other paragraphs of this clause.
- (7) The [Standard Form 1449](#).
- (8) Other documents, exhibits, and attachments.
- (9) The specification.
- (t) [Reserved]
- (u) Unauthorized Obligations.

(1) Except as stated in paragraph (u)(2) of this clause, when any supply or service acquired under this contract is subject to any End User License Agreement (EULA), Terms of Service (TOS), or similar legal instrument or agreement, that includes any clause requiring the Government to indemnify the Contractor or any person or entity for damages, costs, fees, or any other loss or liability that would create an Anti-Deficiency Act violation (31 U.S.C. 1341), the following shall govern:

- (i) Any such clause is unenforceable against the Government.
- (ii) Neither the Government nor any Government authorized end user shall be deemed to have agreed to such clause by virtue of it appearing in the EULA, TOS, or similar legal instrument or agreement. If the EULA, TOS, or similar legal instrument or agreement is invoked through an "I agree" click box or other comparable mechanism (e.g., "click-wrap" or "browse-wrap" agreements), execution does not bind the Government or any Government authorized end user to such clause.
- (iii) Any such clause is deemed to be stricken from the EULA, TOS, or similar legal instrument or agreement.

(2) Paragraph (u)(1) of this clause does not apply to indemnification by the Government that is expressly authorized by statute and specifically authorized under applicable agency regulations and procedures.

(v) Incorporation by reference. The Contractor's representations and certifications, including those completed electronically via the System for Award Management (SAM), are incorporated by reference into the contract.

I. SCHEDULE OF SERVICES

01. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

The Contractor shall furnish Dry Cleaning, Repair, and Alteration Services for staff located at the FPS Physical Security Training Center, defined in the statement of work and BPA exhibits,

02. CONTRACT TYPE

Services shall be furnished via Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) with fixed unit prices issued under FAR Part 12 and 13.106 and 13.303. Resultant Calls under this BPA will be Fixed Price.

03. ESTIMATED QUANTITIES

a. The total estimated ceiling value of the BPA is the total awarded price, inclusive of all Optional Ordering Periods.

b. The Schedule of Supplies/Services and Prices (i.e. the Schedule) sets forth the estimated quantity Dry Cleaning, Repair, and Alteration Services that the Government may order per each stated Option ordering period. The estimated quantities set forth in the Schedule are based upon the current, known Dry Cleaning, Repair, and Alteration Services requirements with adjustments to provide for maximum ordering flexibility. The Government reserves the right to order up to the estimated quantities set forth in the Schedule.

c. Each call issued under this BPA will be issued for the actual known Dry Cleaning, Repair, and Alteration Services requirement at that time, will be accompanied by the location and other information needed to deliver and install the equipment. Contractors will be paid only for Dry Cleaning, Repair, and Alteration Services ordered and delivered at the established unit prices as contained in the calls. The Government has the unilateral right to add, decrease, cancel, or modify quantities stated in each call issued at the established unit prices, as long as the change is within the scope of the BPA and the associated call. The cumulative total of all orders issued under the BPA shall not exceed the BPA estimated ceiling price and/or estimated quantities unless and until the Contracting Officer notifies the contractor in writing that the BPA ceiling price has been increased and specifies in the notice a revised ceiling price that shall constitute the estimated ceiling price for performance under this BPA.

04. PRICES

All Calls issued against the BPA are fixed price and subject the terms and conditions of the BPA.

II. PACKING AND MARKING

01. PAYMENT OF POSTAGE AND FEES

All postage and fees related to submitting information, including forms, reports, etc., to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's Representative shall be paid by the Contractor.

02. MARKING

All information submitted to the Contracting Officer or the Contracting Officer's Representative shall clearly indicate the BPA and call number for which the information is being submitted.

III. DELIVERIES OR PERFORMANCE

01. TERM OF BPA

The full term of the BPA will be up to Five Years, if all established Optional Ordering Periods are utilized. The start and end dates for the base ordering period and each additional Optional Ordering Period will be defined within the resultant BPA. Established optional ordering periods may be exercised in accordance with FAR 52.217-9 - Option to Extend the Term of the Contract.

IV. CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION DATA

A. Invoices submitted by other than these three methods will not be processed and will be returned.

C. Contractors shall provide an informational copy of each invoice to the Contract Specialist for the Call and the Contracting Officer's Representative, Russel T. Dingman at russel.r.dingman@fps.dhs.gov, concurrent with submission to the designated billing office referenced above.

D. In addition to the information required for a proper invoice as identified in FAR 52.212-4 (g)(1), Contract Terms and Conditions – Commercial Items, the contractor shall include the following information:

1. Annotate "FPS HQ on the face of each invoice
2. Clearly identify the period of performance for which the services were rendered or the date the supplies were delivered to the government

A release discharging the Government, its officers, agents and employees of and from all liabilities, obligations, and claims arising out of or under this BPA subject only to the exceptions listed at FAR 52.212-4, paragraph (i) is a condition precedent to final payment.

02. PAYMENTS

A. Payment will be made on a calendar month basis in arrears upon submission of an invoice. Payment will be due on the 30th calendar day after receipt of a proper invoice or date of receipt of services, whichever is later.

B. It is the objective of the Government to obtain complete and satisfactory performance in accordance with the terms of specifications and requirements of this BPA. The criteria for deductions and adjustments below will be used by the Government in determining monetary deductions for nonperformance of work under this BPA and for adjustments for deficiencies in the performance of work. In no event shall contractor invoice or the Government be obligated to pay for any Dry Cleaning quantities in excess of the amount identified within the BPA (inclusive of all modifications).

C. The Contractor is responsible for submitting accurate invoices that reflect the actual delivery as stated in the Call. Repeated substantiated errors in invoicing may adversely affect the performance assessments assigned during the pendency of the BPA. Submission of false invoices shall be subject to contractual and legal actions.

The CO alone is authorized to take action on behalf of the Government to amend, modify or deviate from the BPA's terms and conditions; make final decisions on unsatisfactory performance; terminate the BPA order for convenience or cause; and issue final decisions regarding questions or matters under dispute. The CO may delegate certain other responsibilities to an authorized representative.

B. Contracting Officer's Representative (COR)

2. The COR is designated to assist the CO in the discharge of his or her responsibilities when he or she is unable to be directly in touch with the BPA Call work. The responsibilities of the COR and his/her alternate include, but are not limited to: determining the adequacy of performance by the Contractor in accordance with the terms and conditions of the BPA, acting as the Government's representative in charge of work at the site(s); ensuring compliance with the BPA requirements insofar as the actual performance is concerned; advising the Contractor of proposed deductions for non-performance or unsatisfactory performance; and advising the CO of any factors which may cause delay in the performance of work.

FAR 52.217-9 - OPTION TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE CONTRACT (MAR 2000)

(a) The Government may extend the term of this contract by written notice to the contractor at least 30 days before the contract expires; provided that the Government gives the contractor a preliminary written notice of its intent to extend at least 30 days before the contract expires. The preliminary notice does not commit the Government to an extension.

BANKRUPTCY (Tailored)

In the event the contractor becomes insolvent or enters into proceedings relating to bankruptcy or business dissolution under any chapter of the United States Bankruptcy Code, whether voluntary or involuntary, the contractor agrees to furnish, via overnight or express mail or electronic commerce method authorized by the contract, written notification of the proceeding to the contracting officer responsible for administering the BPA. This notification *shall* be furnished within three days of the

Inverted Domestic Corporation. A foreign incorporated entity shall be treated as an inverted domestic corporation if, pursuant to a plan (or a series of related transactions)—

- (1) The entity completes the direct or indirect acquisition of substantially all of the properties held directly or indirectly by a domestic corporation or substantially all of the properties constituting a trade or business of a domestic partnership;
- (2) After the acquisition at least 80 percent of the stock (by vote or value) of the entity is held—
 - (i) In the case of an acquisition with respect to a domestic corporation, by former shareholders of the domestic corporation by reason of holding stock in the domestic corporation; or
 - (ii) In the case of an acquisition with respect to a domestic partnership, by former partners of the domestic partnership by reason of holding a capital or profits interest in the domestic partnership; and
- (3) The expanded affiliated group which after the acquisition includes the entity does not have substantial business activities in the foreign country in which or under the law of which the entity is created or organized when compared to the total business activities of such expanded affiliated group.

Person, domestic, and foreign have the meanings given such terms by paragraphs (1), (4), and (5) of section 7701(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, respectively.

(c) Special rules. The following definitions and special rules shall apply when determining whether a foreign incorporated entity should be treated as an inverted domestic corporation.

- (1) *Certain stock disregarded.* For the purpose of treating a foreign incorporated entity as an inverted domestic corporation these shall not be taken into account in determining ownership:
 - (i) Stock held by members of the expanded affiliated group which includes the foreign incorporated entity; or
 - (ii) Stock of such entity which is sold in a public offering related to an acquisition described in section 835(b)(1) of the Homeland Security Act, 6 U.S.C. 395(b)(1).
- (2) *Plan deemed in certain cases.* If a foreign incorporated entity acquires directly or indirectly substantially all of the properties of a domestic corporation or partnership during the 4-year

period beginning on the date which is 2 years before the ownership requirements of subsection (b)(2) are met, such actions shall be treated as pursuant to a plan.

(3) *Certain transfers disregarded.* The transfer of properties or liabilities (including by contribution or distribution) shall be disregarded if such transfers are part of a plan a principal purpose of which is to avoid the purposes of this section.

(d) *Special rule for related partnerships.* For purposes of applying section 835(b) of the Homeland Security Act, 6 U.S.C. 395(b) to the acquisition of a domestic partnership, except as provided in regulations, all domestic partnerships which are under common control (within the meaning of section 482 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986) shall be treated as a partnership.

(e) Treatment of Certain Rights.

(1) Certain rights shall be treated as stocks to the extent necessary to reflect the present value of all equitable interests incident to the transaction, as follows:

- (i) warrants;
- (ii) options;
- (iii) contracts to acquire stock;
- (iv) convertible debt instruments; and

(2) Rights labeled as stocks shall not be treated as stocks whenever it is deemed appropriate to do so to reflect the present value of the transaction or to disregard transactions whose recognition would defeat the purpose of Section 835.

FAR 52.204-25 - PROHIBITION ON CONTRACTING FOR CERTAIN TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SERVICES OR EQUIPMENT (DEVIATION 20-05) (DEC 2020)

(a) *Definitions.* As used in this clause—

“Backhaul” means intermediate links between the core network, or backbone network, and the small subnetworks at the edge of the network (e.g., connecting cell phones/towers to the core telephone network). Backhaul can be wireless (e.g., microwave) or wired (e.g., fiber optic, coaxial cable, Ethernet).

“Covered foreign country” means The People’s Republic of China.

“Covered telecommunications equipment or services” means—

(1) Telecommunications equipment produced by Huawei Technologies Company or ZTE Corporation (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities);

(2) For the purpose of public safety, security of Government facilities, physical security surveillance of critical infrastructure, and other national security purposes, video surveillance and telecommunications equipment produced by Hytera Communications Corporation, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, or Dahua Technology Company (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities);

(3) Telecommunications or video surveillance services provided by such entities or using such equipment; or

(4) Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country.

“Critical technology” means—

(1) Defense articles or defense services included on the United States Munitions List set forth in the International Traffic in Arms Regulations under subchapter M of chapter I of title 22, Code of Federal Regulations;

(2) Items included on the Commerce Control List set forth in Supplement No. 1 to part 774 of the Export Administration Regulations under subchapter C of chapter VII of title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, and controlled—

(i) Pursuant to multilateral regimes, including for reasons relating to national security, chemical and biological weapons proliferation, nuclear nonproliferation, or missile technology; or

(ii) For reasons relating to regional stability or surreptitious listening;

(3) Specially designed and prepared nuclear equipment, parts and components, materials, software, and technology covered by part 810 of title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (relating to assistance to foreign atomic energy activities);

(4) Nuclear facilities, equipment, and material covered by part 110 of title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (relating to export and import of nuclear equipment and material);

(5) Select agents and toxins covered by part 331 of title 7, Code of Federal Regulations, part 121 of title 9 of such Code, or part 73 of title 42 of such Code; or

(6) Emerging and foundational technologies controlled pursuant to section 1758 of the Export Control Reform Act of 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4817).

“Interconnection arrangements” means arrangements governing the physical connection of two or more networks to allow the use of another’s network to hand off traffic where it is ultimately

delivered (e.g., connection of a customer of telephone provider A to a customer of telephone company B) or sharing data and other information resources.

“Reasonable inquiry” means an inquiry designed to uncover any information in the entity’s possession about the identity of the producer or provider of covered telecommunications equipment or services used by the entity that excludes the need to include an internal or third-party audit.

“Roaming” means cellular communications services (e.g., voice, video, data) received from a visited network when unable to connect to the facilities of the home network either because signal coverage is too weak or because traffic is too high.

“Substantial or essential component” means any component necessary for the proper function or performance of a piece of equipment, system, or service.

(b) *Prohibition.*

(1) Section 889(a)(1)(A) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (Pub. L. 115–232) prohibits the head of an executive agency on or after August 13, 2019, from procuring or obtaining, or extending or renewing a contract to procure or obtain, any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. The Contractor is prohibited from providing to the Government any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system, unless an exception at paragraph (c) of this clause applies or the covered telecommunication equipment or services are covered by a waiver described in FAR 4.2104.

(2) Section 889(a)(1)(B) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (Pub. L. 115–232) prohibits the head of an executive agency on or after August 13, 2020, from entering into a contract, or extending or renewing a contract, with an entity that uses any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system, unless an exception at paragraph (c) of this clause applies or the covered telecommunication equipment or services are covered by a waiver described in FAR 4.2104. This prohibition applies to the use of covered telecommunications equipment or services, regardless of whether that use is in performance of work under a Federal contract.

(c) *Exceptions.* This clause does not prohibit contractors from providing—

- (1) A service that connects to the facilities of a third-party, such as backhaul, roaming, or interconnection arrangements; or
- (2) Telecommunications equipment that cannot route or redirect user data traffic or permit visibility into any user data or packets that such equipment transmits or otherwise handles.

For indefinite delivery contracts, the Contractor shall report to the NOSC, Contracting Officer for the indefinite delivery contract and the Contracting Officer(s) and Contracting Officer’s Representative(s) for any affected order or, in the case of the Department of Defense, identify both the indefinite delivery contract and any affected orders in the report provided at <https://dibnet.dod.mil>.

(2) The Contractor shall report the following information pursuant to paragraph (d)(1) of this clause

- (i) Within one business day from the date of such identification or notification: the contract number; the order number(s), if applicable; supplier name; supplier unique entity identifier (if known); supplier Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) code (if known); brand; model number (original equipment manufacturer number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number); item description; and any readily available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended.
- (ii) Within 10 business days of submitting the information in paragraph (d)(2)(i) of this clause: any further available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended. In addition, the Contractor shall describe the efforts it undertook to prevent use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services, and any additional efforts that will be incorporated to prevent future use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services.

(e) *Subcontracts*. The Contractor shall insert the substance of this clause, including this paragraph (e) and excluding paragraph (b)(2), in all subcontracts and other contractual instruments, including subcontracts for the acquisition of commercial items.

STATEMENT OF WORK (SOW)

1.0 GENERAL

1.1 BACKGROUND

The Homeland Security Act of 2002 charges the Federal Protective Service (FPS) with protecting the building, grounds and property that are owned, occupied or secured by the Federal Government and the persons on the property. The FPS mission focuses on reducing vulnerability of Federal facilities to criminal and terrorist threats, while ensuring that the facilities are safe and secure for employees and visitors. FPS conducts much of its introductory and recurring training at the FPS Physical Security Training Center, within the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC) in Glynco, Georgia. The training is provided to ensure that all FPS Law Enforcement Personnel are prepared to complete the mission needs and requirements of FPS.

1.2 SCOPE

The FPS Training and Professional Development Division (TPD) has a need for contracted daily, for dry cleaning (clean and press) and maintenance services of staff uniforms for law enforcement personnel stationed at FLETC in support of the TPD training division in meeting its strategic goals and objectives. This program is under the technical direction of the FPS Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) and Project Manager assigned to this project within TPD.

2.0 SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

2.1 UNIFORM CLEANING SERVICES

The Contractor shall provide the following cleaning services. Dry cleaning of staff uniforms on a yearly basis includes the following:

- Shirts (polo and button up unisex style) = 2,500 per year
- Pants = 2,500 per year
- Neck Ties = 50 per year
- Jackets = 50 per year
- Uniform Coat and Trousers (suit) = 250 per year
- Sewing/Affixing of Patches = 50 per year
- Replacement of Damage Zippers on Uniforms=50 per year
- Pick up Delivery= 96 per year

Provision of individually labeled laundry bags for each staff member stationed at the FLETC center. All returned garments shall be clean and free from soil, perspiration, fluid stains and blood. Any items submitted as clean to FPS not meeting the preceding qualifications shall be returned to the vendor and cleaned again without additional charge. If the vendor is unable to clean any item due to the magnitude of the stain, the garment shall be returned, and FPS shall not incur any charge for the item. Dry cleaned shirts, pants and jackets shall be returned to FPS on hangers and covered by clear plastic. FPS shall not pay for personal clothing items. If the contractor receives personal clothing items, they shall be returned to FPS unserviced.

2.2 UNIFORM MAINTENANCE SERVICES

The contracted service shall include but not be limited to the following maintenance services:

- Alterations of staff uniforms as required. The contractor shall take the necessary measurements as needed and provide any miscellaneous material required for the alterations. All actual alterations shall be performed at the contractor's site.
- Mending or repairing uniforms as required. Repairs include but are not limited to the replacement of zippers, tears, open seams and holes. Contractor shall mend or repair items using thread and material of the same quality, color and texture as used by FPS. Any official patches or FPS insignia will be provided by FPS to the vendor only as necessary with zero excess inventory allotment.
- Button replacement of staff uniforms as needed. All buttons must be intact on all garments. Broken or missing buttons will be replaced with items identically matching those used by FPS.
- Creasing of staff uniforms as required.

2.3 EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Contractor shall respond to all emergency calls within 12 hours from the time the call is placed. Emergency dry cleaning and alterations shall be completed and delivered within 36 hours of placement of the order.

2.4 SERVICES REQUIRING AUTHORIZATION

The following services shall require authorization:

- Alterations and repairs shall be approved by the FPS CO, COR, or other person authorized in writing by the CO before it is started.
- Any requests for replacement patches shall be submitted in writing to the COR or Program Manager.
- Payments shall not be made for any unauthorized services or for any unauthorized changes to the work specified herein. This includes any alteration services performed by the contractor of their own volition or at the request of an individual other than a duly appointed Contracting Officer (CO), COR, or other person authorized in writing by the CO.
- Only a duly appointed CO is authorized to change the specifications, terms, and conditions under this effort.

2.5 UNIFORM CARE

The Contractor shall have knowledge of appropriate cleaning solvents and methods utilized to avoid damage or discoloring of the FPS uniform material.

Disposal of any FPS uniforms or patches is strictly prohibited without the written consent of the FPS CO, COR, or FPS Program Manager authorized to dispose of FPS material.

3.0 OTHER APPLICABLE CONDITIONS

The Contractor shall abide (at a minimum the following laws, rules, and guidelines) by all applicable regulations in performing all tasks. If the following laws, rules, or guidelines are updated; the contractor must follow the current laws, rules, and guidelines. The contractor shall report any violation to the applicable governmental agency.

A violation of applicable laws, rules, or regulations may result in termination of this contract. The Contractor shall be held liable for adhering to regulations such as the following (listed in alphabetical order):

Accessibility Requirements Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act (29 U.S.C. 794d), as amended by the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (P.L. 105-220), August 7, 1998; American Disabilities Act (ADA); Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA); Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Contractor is responsible for compliance with Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requirements for handling, storage and disposal of cleaning solvents and workplace safety. The contractor is responsible for all permits and licenses required to perform the stated uniform cleaning and maintenance services.

4.0 PROGRAM ORGANIZATION

This program is under the technical direction of the COR or TPOC National Training Academy Division (NTA)

4.1. CONTRACTOR MANAGEMENT ORGANIZATION

The Contractor shall appoint a program manager to represent the Contractor for all activities and have the ability to make decisions on behalf of his/her company.
The Contractor shall provide a point of contact (POC) sheet, listing key personnel, such as a facility manager, delivery manager and/or laundry manager and their respective telephone numbers and e-mail addresses if appropriate.

4.2 CONTRACTOR LIABILITY

If the Contractor damages any equipment under this effort due to negligence of any type, the Contractor will be responsible for the replacement cost.

4.3 DELIVERY SCHEDULE

The Contractor shall offer pick-up and delivery of FPS-TPD dry cleaning daily for the following facility:

4.4 CONTRACTOR DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor is responsible for the transportation of FPS materials to and from the FLETC facility. The contractor is responsible for all permits and licenses required to perform pickup and delivery services. The Contractor shall contact FPS 24 hours prior to expected delivery if additional turnaround time is required for certain items. Contractor is responsible for providing delivery persons who meet the requirements for entry onto the FLETC.

4.5 GOVERNMENT LIABILITY

The Government shall not be liable for any injury or damage to the Contractor's personnel, contractor's property, and contractor's vehicle, unless such injury or damage is due to negligence on the part of the

Government and is recoverable under the Federal Torts Claims Act, or pursuant to another Federal statutory authority.

4.6 CONTRACTOR LIABILITY

If any of FPS's uniforms or patches is misplaced or stolen, the Contractor shall notify FPS within one (1) hour of being aware of the lost or theft. FPS will act as deemed necessary.

In the event that the Contractor damages an FPS uniform, or component thereof, due to negligence of any type the contractor is responsible for the replacement of affected uniform, or component thereof. Negligence includes mechanical or chemical damage or damage resulting from procedural, handling, alteration or transportation error.

4.7 PERSONNEL SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

FPS-TPD personnel will coordinate with the contractor for access to FLETC as required. Contractor personnel entering the federal facilities shall be given a temporary badge assigned by security. The COR or designee will sign for them and remain with them the entire time on site and while performing work. Once the delivery or pick-up is complete, the contractor personnel shall return to the entrance to sign out and turn in the temporary badge.

While on FLETC property, the Contractor personnel shall be easily recognizable as Contractor employees. The Contractor shall wear distinctive clothing bearing the name of the company and wear appropriate badges, representing the contractor's company name and the employee's name.

4.8 POST AWARD CONFERENCE

The Contractor shall attend a Post Award Conference with the Contracting Officer and the COR no later than 10 business days after the date of award. The purpose of the Post Award Conference, which will be chaired by the Contracting Officer, is to discuss technical and contracting objectives of this contract and review the Contractor's draft project plan. The Post Award Conference will be held at the Government's facility, located at the primary site documented in 4.3 or via teleconference.

4.9 PROGRESS REPORTS

The Project Manager shall provide a monthly progress report to the Contracting Officer and COR via electronic mail. This report shall include a summary of all Contractor work performed, including a breakdown of labor hours by labor category, all direct costs by line item, an assessment of technical progress, schedule status, any travel conducted and any Contractor concerns or recommendations for the previous reporting period.

4.10 SUSTAINABILITY REQUIREMENTS

FPS is committed to conduct its business operations in an environmentally sound manner. FPS expects its suppliers and contractors to provide, at the same quality and price, products and services that will minimize the environmental impact of the service provided. The contractor shall use sustainable products and implement sustainable practices to the maximum extent possible without jeopardizing the intended end use or detracting from the overall quality delivered to the end user. This may include, but is not limited to:

(Field Assistance Bulletin No. 2006-3 (Dec. 14 2006)). Accordingly this wage determination will not apply to any exempt computer employee regardless of which of these two exemptions is utilized.

2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands face or arms of the employee engaged in the operation irritation of the skin minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving unloading storage and hauling of ordnance explosive and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance explosives and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract by the employer by the state or local law etc.) the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost) reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning daily washing or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract by the contractor by law or by the nature of the work there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

Such conforming procedures shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)). The Wage and Hour Division shall make a final determination of conformed classification wage rate and/or fringe benefits which shall be paid to all employees performing in the classification from the first day of work on which contract work is performed by them in the classification. Failure to pay such unlisted employees the compensation agreed upon by the interested parties and/or fully determined by the Wage and Hour Division retroactive to the date such class of employees commenced contract work shall be a violation of the Act and this contract. (See 29

CFR 4.6(b)(2)(v)). When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract a separate SF-1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award the contractor prepares a written report listing in order the proposed classification title(s) a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s) job description(s) and rationale for proposed wage rate(s) including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved or where there is no authorized representative the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees to the U.S. Department of Labor Wage and Hour Division for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt the Wage and Hour Division approves modifies or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.
- 6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(iii)).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper. When preparing a conformance request the ""Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations"" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. By submitting a proposal, the Contractor agrees to comply with all terms and conditions set forth in this RFQ, including the Statement of Work (SOW).

EVALUATION FACTORS

FPS will evaluate all responses received using the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFQ. The resulting Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) will be issued to the vendor that provides the best value. The non-price factors of Relevant Past Performance as applicable are listed below in descending order of importance and when combined, are significantly more important than price.

Non-Price Factors:

Factor 1 - Past Performance:

A. The Vendor shall demonstrate relevant past performance or affirmatively state that it possesses no relevant past performance. Relevant past performance is performance under projects (currently being performed or performed within the past three years) that is of a similar or directly related scope, magnitude and complexity to that which is described in the solicitation and as defined below. The Government will consider the quality of the Vendor's relevant past performance. Information provided in response to this factor will assist the Government in determining the degree of risk associated with award of this project to the Vendor in question based up that Vendor's past and present performance on other projects-

B. The Vendor shall submit one (1) project for evaluation. Where teaming arrangements are proposed, an additional maximum of two (2) projects for the subcontractor or other partner shall be submitted. For each submitted project, the Vendor shall include references, using the form at Attachment 4 to provide the requested past project information. For each of the projects submitted, the Vendor shall ensure that a Past Performance Questionnaire (Attachment 5) is sent to customers to provide feedback. The Vendor shall instruct customers to complete the questionnaire and return it to james.austin@associates.fps.dhs.gov by the RFQ submission due date. The Government reserves the right to obtain information for use in the evaluation of past performance from sources other than those identified by the Vendor to upgrade or downgrade the Past Performance rating. An evaluation of relevance will be done for no more than three projects submitted by the Vendor and for no more than three projects submitted for a subcontractor or other partner. The Vendor is therefore cautioned to

submit only its three most relevant efforts and is cautioned to submit only the most relevant efforts of its subcontractor or other partner. If the Vendor or its subcontractor or other partner submits more than two projects for consideration, only one per entity will be reviewed. The one reviewed for each entity will be the first one as displayed within the proposal from front to back.

C. The Government will determine the relevance of a past performance project/contract by analyzing its scope, magnitude and complexity and comparing it to the RFQ.

D. Where a contractor provides projects performed by its managers, key personnel, sub-contractor's or other partners for consideration, the Government will evaluate the past performance of its quoted managers, key personnel, sub-contractor or other partners separately and consider its findings about them, in conjunction with information provided as required in paragraph C above, when determining the risk associated with the quote and assigning the appropriate rating to the quote. The Government will determine whether the past performance of a contractor's, managers, key personnel, sub-contractor's or other partners offsets the risk of doing business with a prime contractor that has no or limited experience and past performance of its own. The Government may decide not to attribute to the prime contractor, as an organization, the past performance of its managers, key personnel, sub-contractor's or other partners.

E. If the government attributes to the successful contractor the past performance of its proposed managers, key personnel, sub-contractor's or other partners, the successful contractors quoted use of particular managers, key personnel, sub-contractor's or partners will be incorporated into the resultant BPA as a requirement. In such cases the subject managers, key personnel, sub-contractor or other partners shall not be replaced without prior approval of the Contracting Officer.

Price Factor:

The contractor must submit unit prices and extended prices (i.e. Unit Price x NTE Quantity) for every line item listed under each potential performance period on the RFQ. The Contractor must also provide a Total Estimated Price for each potential option period (i.e. the sum of all line items within that option period). Contractors submitting partial pricing information shall be ineligible for award. The unit price prevails if a discrepancy exists between the unit price and the extended price. Unbalanced pricing exists when, despite an acceptable total evaluated price, the price of one or more line items is significantly overstated or understated. Contractors are advised that the Government may utilize FAR 15.404 processes and techniques as required in the appropriate analysis of quotations received.

The Government shall not be responsible for compensating the contractor for any costs tied to solicitation requirements but not factored into the quoted prices, either by the contractor's intention or by mistake.

Prior to award the contractor may be required to furnish additional information to establish the company's financial responsibility in accordance with FAR 9.104-1.

Basis for Selection:

FPS will evaluate all responses received using the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFQ. The Government intends to evaluate proposals and award a task order without discussions. However, the Government reserves the right to conduct discussions if later determined by the contracting officer to be necessary. The resulting requirement will be issued to the vendor that provides the best value. The non-price factors of Past Performance are listed in descending order of importance and when combined, are significantly more important than price.

Notice of Award

A written notice of award or acceptance of an offer, mailed or otherwise furnished to the successful offeror within the time for acceptance specified in the offer, shall result in a binding contract without further action by either party. Before the offer's specified expiration time, the Government may accept an offer (or part of an offer), whether or not there are negotiations after its receipt, unless a written notice of withdrawal is received before award.
