## All Questions Received by 5PM, September 28, 2022 Question Deadline and SPB Responses:

- 1. Are there any as-built drawings for the sprinkler system at the loading dock area where the contractor will be digging to bury the conduit?
  - SPB Response: This Area belongs to Texas Facilities Commission (TFC). The SPB will not have any drawing for this area but will confirm if TFC can provide to us. (Pending)
- 2. Can the contractor start the work on either of the two (2) days being allowed for preparation prior to the seven (7) days deadline?
  - SPB Response: Yes, the requirement is that the work must begin within two (2) days of the PO being issued. Once the work has begun, it must be completed within seven (7) days.
- 3. Can the sprinkler system for the zone in the area where the work will take place be turned off until after the digging is complete?
  - SPB Response: Yes, the area should be able to be turned off but TFC will need to confirm. (Pending)
- 4. Can loading dock delivery dates/times be coordinated between the SPB and the contractor to ensure the dock is safe when the work is being done in this area?
  - SPB Response: Yes, the SPB can coordinate the loading dock work, but will need to have notice a day or two in advance of when the work will begin in this area.
- 5. Can the contractor perform the work after hours while there are no deliveries being made?

  SPB Response: Yes, contractor will be able to work after hours, but SPB will need to coordinate the timeframe with the contractor.
- 6. Can the contractor park work vehicles in the loading dock area while the work is in progress?

  SPB Response: Yes, no more than two of the contractor's vehicles will be allowed to park in the loading dock area.

  Any other vehicles will need to park elsewhere.
- 7. Can the contractor work OT during the week to help meet the seven (7) day deadline?

  SPB Response: Yes, the contractor can work OT during the week, but will need to inform the SPB what days they would like to work in advance so the SPB can staff accordingly.
- 8. Can the contractor keep material at the loading dock while work is in progress?

  SPB Response: Yes, there will be a spot on the loading dock where the contractor can keep their material.
